Orange / Windsor County Local Work Group Input for Top Ten Conservation Practices FY 23

We respectfully submit the following comments in response to the proposed list of Top Ten practices to be paid at a 90% cost share rate for FY23.

Suggestion: Replace Filter Strips with Riparian Forest Buffer

Reasoning: The NRCS filter strip practice standard is for a 20' wide planting. This does not

meet the RAP requirement of a 25' buffer width. Cost of trees can also be prohibitive.

Suggestion: Replace Waste Storage Facility with Wood Chip Packs or Covered Bedded Packs

Reasoning: These practices are excellent but costly alternatives that are actively being

recommended to farmers and gaining traction. The cost of woodchips and bedding is an ongoing expense that farmers have a difficult time adjusting to, but lead to cost savings over time. The upfront costs of these practices need to be reduced to increase

adoption of these practices.

Suggestion: Add Fencing

Reasoning: Fencing is a consistently underfunded practice that makes adopting rotational grazing

cost prohibitive. If this practice is better suited to be funded at 90% under the new DEC

RCPP, that would be an acceptable alternative, as long as it is available state-wide.

Suggestion: Add Water Systems, Water Storage, and/or Spring Development

Reasoning: These practices are all important in grazing systems. Current payments for waterlines

are far below current actual costs.
